As a Jr. Club Counselor, you should pay your dues before November 1st to avoid paying a penalty. If you do not know the exact number of students, pay the minimum of 20. You can add students later with no penalty for \$1.50 each.


Juniors Day at the Convention is Saturday, October 11th at the DoubleTree Hotel in Newark. Competitions are at 1:15 in the 2nd Presbyterian Church across the street.

Keynote Speaker at the State Convention is Christopher Purdy. He is Host of Music in Mid-Ohio, Musica Sacra, Serentata and the Columbus Symphony Orchestra live broadcasts. Christopher also hosts <u>Classical 101 by Request</u> every Friday from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. He is a New Englander at heart, with strong ties to Manhattan where he lived for many years. Purdy's favorite composers are Monteverdi and Bruckner. An accidental encounter with a beat-up recording of Mozart's "Don Giovanni" at the age of eight changed Purdy's direction from law school or the priesthood to one of classical music and public

The 2013 NFMC Young Artist Winner, pianist Olga Krayterman will perform in concert on Friday, October 10 at the OFMC State Convention. <u>Don't miss it!</u>

Olga is a Belarusian-born American pianist and an accomplished performer of solo and chamber repertoire. She has won numerous national and international competition prizes and at 17 made her orchestral debut with the South Carolina Philharmonic playing Beethoven's 3rd Piano Concerto.

Olga began her studies at the Cincinnati Conservatory and received her Bachelor and Master of Music degrees from the Eastman School of Music. She is presently completing her Doctorate in Piano Performance and Literature at Eastman where she has been a teaching assistant since 2008. She has also taught at the Eastman Community Music School since 2011. She is a delightful, gifted and lovely young musician, and we are proud to present her at our convention. Her program will include music by Griffes, CPE Bach, Scriabin, Chopin and Rachmaninoff.

Eligibility and Rules for Playing at the OFMC Convention

- 1. A student achieving three consecutive superiors in any instrument or vocal event must perform in the festival's honor recital the following year.
- 2. Upon achieving four years of consecutive superiors, the student must perform at the district conference the following year.
- 3. After receiving the fifth consecutive superior in March and satisfying rules one and two above, the student qualifies to perform at the
- convention.
- 5. The eligibility to perform only applies to the main instrument the student plays. Students who are five-year superiors in theory and musicianship test do not qualify.
- 6. If a student participates in two or more instruments, that student must decide which instrument to play. The student is only allowed to perform once with the exception of composition winners.
- 7. Students younger than 7th grade will be entered in the Elizabeth Gerber Competition. One winner will receive \$100.00 award.
- 8. Students who are in grades 7-9 are automatically entered in the Marilyn Walter Young Musicians Competition.
- 9. The first place winner of the Walter Competition will receive \$150.00 but will not be allowed to compete in the same competition the following year. However, if the first place winner is in the 9th grade at the time, he or she may compete in the Gray Competition the following year.
- 10. The second place winner of the Walter Competition will receive \$125.00, and third place winner will receive \$100.00. Both winners will be allowed to compete again the following year in either Walter or Gray Competition as long as they maintain superior ratings in the Junior Festival.
- 11. Students who are in grades 10-12 compete in the W. Alfred and Charlotte Gray Competition.
- 12. Students who reach their eligibility during their senior year may compete in the Gray Competition at the next convention provided they are still 18 years of age in October.
- 13. The first place winner of the Gray Competition will receive \$200.00 but may not compete again the following year. If the winner is in 10th grade at the time of winning first place, he or she may compete again during his or her senior year.
- 14. The second place winner of the Gray Competition will receive \$160, and the third place winner will receive \$130. Both winners may compete again the following year as long as they continue to achieve superior ratings in the junior festival and are less than 19 years of age at the


