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Largest ever

Applications open Jan. 1 for Tuesday Musical's 2025 Scholarship Competition

Akron, OH, Dec. 27, 2024 — Tuesday Musical will accept on-line applications starting Jan. 1 through Jan. 31 for its 2025 Scholarship Competition.


In its 69th year, the 2025 competition is the largest ever in terms of numbers and amounts of scholarships. Twenty-nine scholarships ranging from \$750 to \$2,000 will be awarded for a record total of \$41,050. Among the scholarships are two for \$1,400 each that are sponsored by the Ohio Federation of Music Clubs: the Gertrude Seiberling Scholarship and the Winifred Collins Scholarship.

Hailed as the best in Ohio, the adjudicated competition provides support for talented university and college students embarking on careers as music educators and performers. Invited to apply are music performance and/or music education majors who are Ohio residents or studying with a music teacher at an Ohio college or university. Categories include music education, brass, classical guitar, organ, piano, marimba/classical steel drum, strings, voice, and woodwinds.

The adjudicated competition is Saturday, March 22, at The University of Akron. Organists will compete Saturday, March 15, at Westminster Presbyterian Church in Akron. The first- and second-place winners will then be invited to compete in the Final Round/Winners Concert on Sunday, May 4, for two additional scholarships and a People's Choice Award.

Eligibility: The entrant must be between 15-18 years of age as of March 1 of the competition year. Though it is preferred that the teacher of the contestants be members of the Ohio Federation of Music Clubs through an affiliated Jr. Music Club, it is not required for this competition. The entrant may choose his or her own accompanist and will be responsible for that person's compensation. Rules:

The entrant should complete the application and make a copy of it. Keep one copy and send one copy to Marie Nichols, PO Box 2246, Heath, OH 43056. You may scan and send it to nmusiccenter@mail.com Submission deadline is Monday, March 3, 2025.

There is an entrance fee of \$15.00. Please make out the check to OFMC and mail it to Marie Nichols before the deadline.

Entrants must be prepared to play, from memory, the first or last movement of a Senior Concerto that is listed in the NFMC Festival Bulletin. This can be the Senior Concerto that was performed by the student at Junior Festival. PLEASE play the entire movement without cuts in the solo concerto part. Cuts may be made in the accompaniment part for time considerations.

A contestant cannot win first place two years in succession.

Unless high standards of performance are met, no winner will be declared.

Decision of the judges is final.

One copy of the music being performed must be supplied for the judges.

Please contact Marie Nichols by email or at (740) 877-3847 prior to the competition if you have applied but are unable to compete.

Note: Directions to the competition site are available on Google maps. Please let me know if you need me to send directions to you.

The judges have asked that there be no video submissions due to the disadvantage to the students competing by video and technical difficulties experienced with the judging.
